2004 MELGES 24 US NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

MAY 5 - 8, 2004 • SANTA CRUZ, CALIFORNIA • US Ranking Event 5

The 2004 US National Championship is fast approaching and will be one of the most exciting National Championships in a long time. Hosted by the legendary Santa Cruz Yacht Club in Santa Cruz, California, a highly-competitive fleet of 13 boats (as of March 18, 2004) will be on the start line ready to go after what is one of the most sought after National titles on the International Melges 24 racing circuit.

Currently scheduled to make appearances are local California favorites Peter Dalton. Dave Emberson, Bret Gripenstraw, Dennis Bassano and Tim Hawkins. The Pegasus Teams of Phillippe Kahn and 2003 Melges 24 World Champion Shark Kahn will be out in full force. Bruce Ayres and Don Jesburg will also be on hand giving their all in an attempt to claim the 2004 US National Championship title.

The American teams are not unrivaled. 2003 Ocean Reef Regatta winner "Gill" will be present, making this one of many events they are attending across the US this year. They are a constantly reforming and revolving, strong, brotherly pairing of Simon Strauss and International Melges 24 Class Treasurer, Quentin Strauss. Another European team looking to deliver a National Championship performance is 2003 Melges 24 European Champion Luca Santella and his "Joe Fly" team.

If you have not submitted your entry, then get with the program! Go online now and pre-register for the event. It's really easy. Simply go to the SCYC Web site at www.scyc.org/melges24/index.htm and fill out the pre-entry form. Entries close on April 23rd. Registration will begin on May 4th. A practice race will be held on

Wednesday, May 5th. And, official racing commences on Thursday, May 6th and continues on through Saturday, May 8th. Three races are scheduled each day to take advantage of the world-class racing conditions off of Lighthouse Point. Impressive, westerly winds have been known to push the Melges 24 to top speeds, so don't be surprised to find yourself continuously planing downwind.


