Among these efforts is another incredible line-up of thirteen North American Ranking events including the very popular Sperry Top-Sider St. Petersburg NOOD, a West Coast U.S. National Championship, a midwest Gold Cup and a super World Championship in Annapolis. Although Key West is an exciting venue and the class has been the largest many years running; without fail St. Pete's, year-after-year delivers one of the largest collections of Corinthian players. The USMCA is always so proud of the participation level at this event as it brings out many of our weekend warriors, amateur drivers and new fleet comers.

Speaking of Corinthians, some of you may have already noticed that we have instituted some new Corinthian entry policies. At all major events where the USMCA sanctions a Corinthian division, there are now firm deadlines for entries with a challenge period to follow. What is and who is a Cat 1, Cat 2 and Cat 3 is a hot topic. Full crew lists of each team will be made available to the public prior to an event so should you have any questions, there is ample time for the USMCA to address those issues without affecting the racing, results and/or prize giving. Once the challenge period is up, that is it. Who has qualified at that time, is what is in effect for the event.

All USMCA Corinthian Declaration forms should be submitted to me by the deadline via email (joy.dunigan@melges24.com), or faxed to +1 (912) 756-6728. DO NOT submit these to the regatta and/or Organizing Authorities.

Additional initiatives include the newly created 2009 U.S. Championship Series, (see page 7). All of the USMCA District Governors (DG) really put in a lot of thought and energy to build what we hope will be a fun and alternative catalyst for more fleet growth at the local level. A special thank you goes out to each DG as they really gave careful thought to which events were the best ones for the Series. Stay close to the USMCA website as all the latest and greatest with this new movement will be posted as it happens.

Another quick item to point out that has changed, and effective January 1 is that Sail Stickers are no longer available through Melges Performance Sailboats. Not only has the actual cost of the Sail Stickers increased, but the International Melges 24 Class Association is solely responsible for distributing these and can be purchased online at melges24.com.

As always, I love being at all the events and most of all really enjoy seeing everyone and catching up with what's new and fresh on your mind. I try to keep an open-mind policy. Don't hesitate to make suggestions and pitch new ideas. This is your class and I encourage you to be involved.

### **HOW IT WORKS**

Seattle, WA

- Scoring is tracked by sail number. Should an owner sell his/her boat and acquire a new one, their results will score under the new sail number.
- Each sail number's (boat) five best regattas count toward his/her final score with at least one of the events being counted as a regional event in a district that is not a North American Ranking event.
- This series uses a high point scoring system as follows:

1st = 40 points 2nd = 39 points 3rd = 38 points ... = etc. 40th = 1 point

41st or beyond receives no USCS points, yet, receives participation points

- · Participation points are awarded as follows:
  - Each sail number (boat) receives 5 points for regional events
  - Each sail number (boat) receives 10 points for NA Ranking events
- To qualify, each sail number (boat) must maintain a current USMCA membership.
